Position Title: Elementary/Middle School Tutor (Independent Contractor/Part-Time/Temporary)

Background: The mission of the New Bedford Community Connections Coalition (NBCCC) is to take a leadership role within the City of New Bedford in facilitating collaborative strategies to build neighborhood-based networks of family support to prevent child abuse and neglect, strengthen families, and build healthier communities. **The United Way of Greater New Bedford (UWGNB)** is the fiscal sponsor for NBCCC.

Position: NBCCC is seeking one Academic tutor to provide basic educational support to Greater New Bedford area students in grades ranging 2-8 that are in need of help with their schoolwork. The tutor will provide support, assistance, and encouragement to students who need assistance improving in basic subjects such as Reading/Language Arts, Math, and Science.

Responsibilities:

- Commit to a minimum total of 2-4 hours per week for each individual student (age appropriate) for 14-16 weeks, including prep time
- Review classroom or curricula topics and assignments with students
- Assist students with homework, projects, test preparation, papers, research and other academic tasks
- Work with students to help them understand key concepts, especially those learned in the classroom
- Teach skills to improve academic performance, including study strategies, note-taking skills and approaches to answering test questions
- Demonstrate academic best practices for specific subjects and assignments, including research and writing tactics
- Develop and distribute teaching materials to supplement classroom lessons, including study guides
- Conduct practice tests to track progress, identify areas of improvement and help set goals for exam preparation when needed
- Provide students positive and constructive feedback
- Offer feedback on progress to students' parents and teachers where appropriate
- Maintain a fun but educational atmosphere
- Complete biweekly timesheet

Qualifications:

- Must be at least 18 years old and have completed at least one-year of postsecondary education
- Willingness to commit to up to 15 hours per week
- Prior teaching experience highly desirable
